A FEW BILLS NYSDA IS MONITORING

▶ NYSDA Bill to Expand Dentists' Scope of Practice: Senator Andrew Gounardes has introduced S6383, legislation that would expand the scope of dental practice by eliminating the requirement that the services provided by a dentist, while limited to the oral and maxillofacial area, will no longer be restricted to services only "related to restoring and maintaining dental health." The reference to "dental health" is a useless circular reference and "restoring and maintaining" limits the full breadth of the profession's goal of oral and maxillofacial improvement.

Dental Hygiene Bill: Currently, qualified dental hygienists with the necessary certification can administer nitrous oxide and local infiltration anesthesia while under the personal supervision of a dentist in conjunction with the performance

of dental hygiene procedures. This amendment would allow them to administer such anesthesia in preparation for all dental procedures provided by a dentist, even if such procedures are not defined as dental hygiene services under the law.

- Dental Therapist Bill: We are currently monitoring dental therapist bill (S819/A1749), which would allow for the licensure of dental therapists and advanced dental therapists in NYS. NYSDA opposes this bill.
- NYSDA Bill to Amend Dental Practice Act: This bill amends the Dental Practice Act so that dental assistants are authorized to place and remove temporary restorations, which is part of their dental assisting curriculum/training.
